## Rehousing Fund (RH) Report | September 2025

More than 100 community partners have come together to create the Oregon Worker Relief Fund, a rapid community-based system that provides temporary financial support like the Rehousing Fund.

A fund supporting Oregonian households experiencing homelessness by providing culturally responsive services essential for securing stable housing.

### Amount Disbursed



**\$1,772,000**

Rehousing Fund has allocated over **\$1.7 million** in relief to Oregonians experiencing homelessness or similar.



**\$15,821**

Average aid disbursed to Oregon's community.

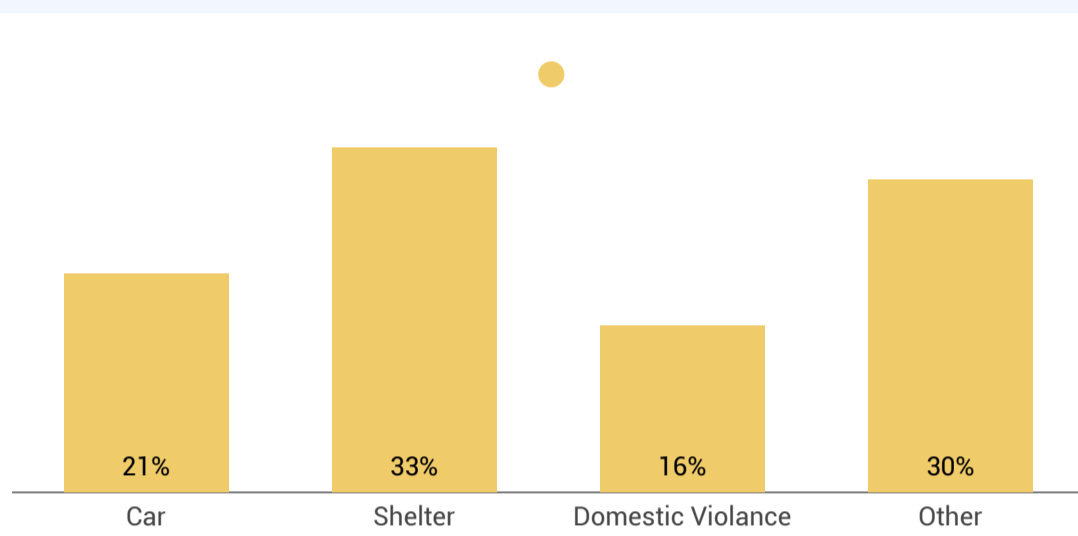
### Number of Recipients Who Received Aid



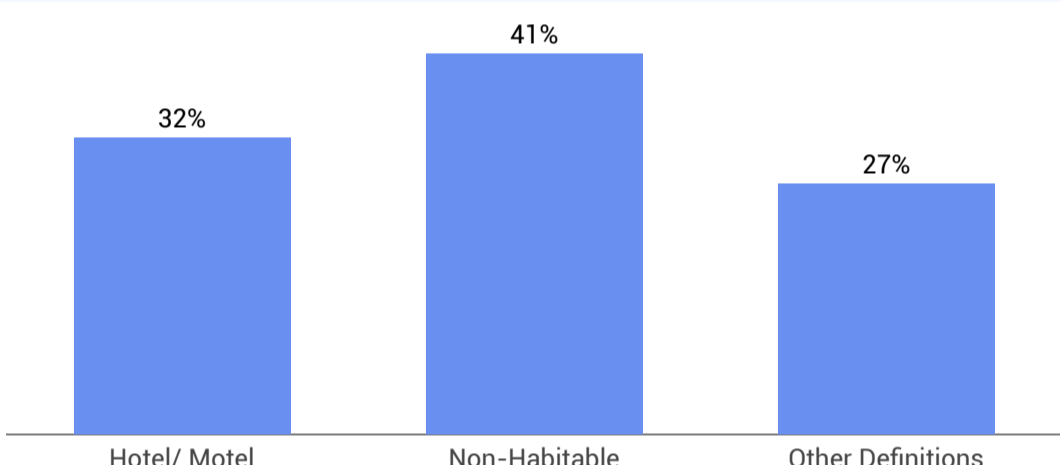

### Housing Situation for Rehousing Fund Recipients



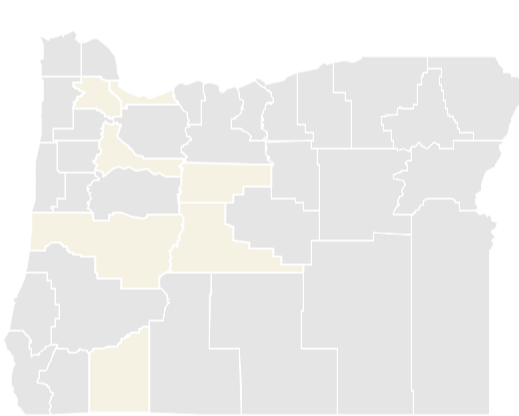
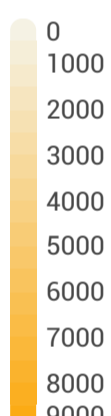
### Other types of housing for RH Fund Recipients

\*Other Definitions of Homelessness = Experiencing overcrowding with minors

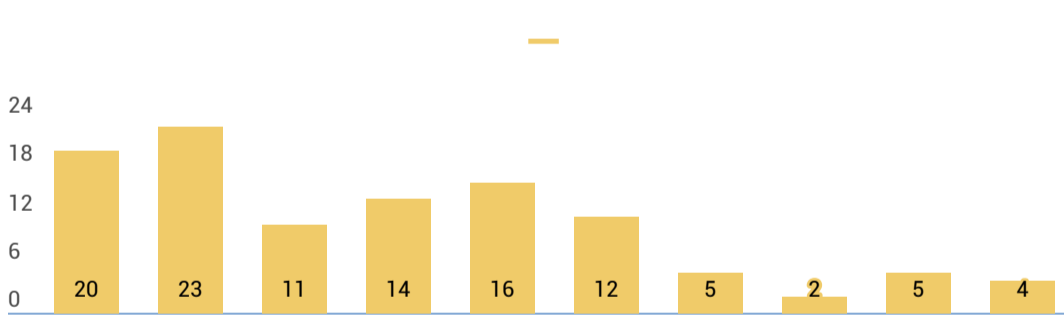
### Financial Relief Disbursed Throughout Oregon

OWR's presence in Oregon is significant. Rehousing Fund has provided financial relief in 7 counties in Oregon.



\*Not all applicants had an address to provide - for this reason we were only able to identify 69 applicants out of the 112 on which county they reside\*

### Family Size of Rehousing Fund Recipients

Oregonian families served by the RH Fund ranged in size from single-person households to large families.



19% of RH recipients have at least 1 dependent minor child



28% of RH recipients have at least 2 dependent minor children
