Rehousing Fund (RH) Report | April 2026

More than 100 community partners have come together to create the Oregon Worker Relief Network, a rapid community-based system that provides temporary financial support like the Rehousing Fund. The Rehousing Fund supports Oregonian households experiencing homelessness by providing culturally responsive services essential for securing stable housing.

Rehousing Fund has allocated over **\$3 million** in relief to Oregonians experiencing homelessness or similar.

Average amount spent per household.

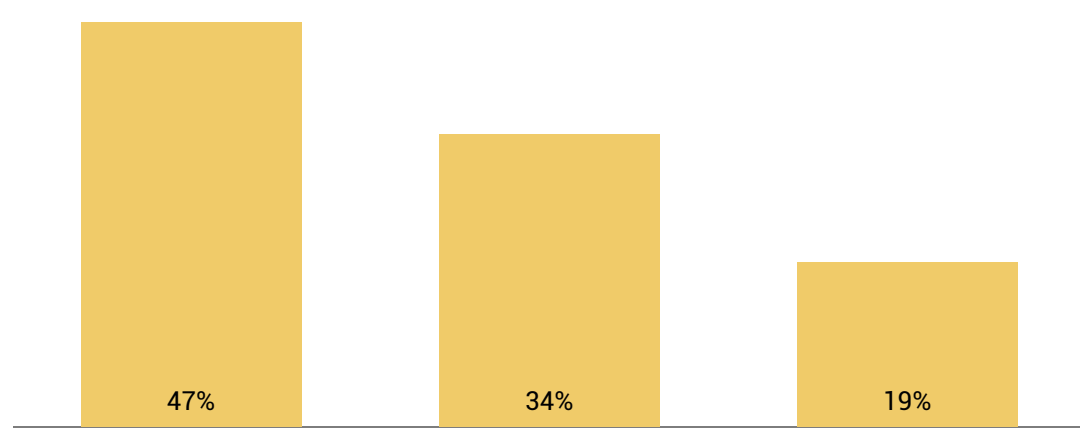

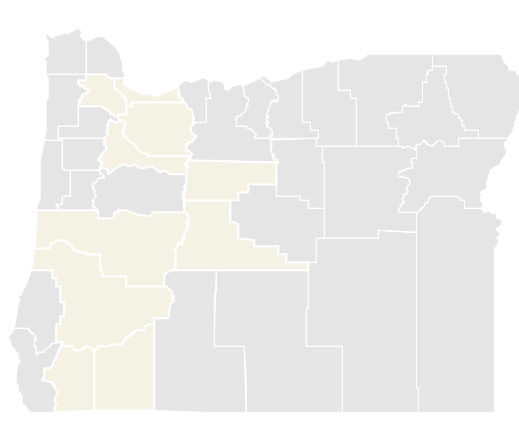
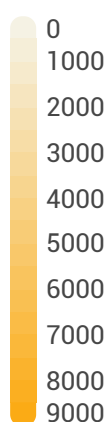

Housing Situation Before Receiving Rehousing Fund



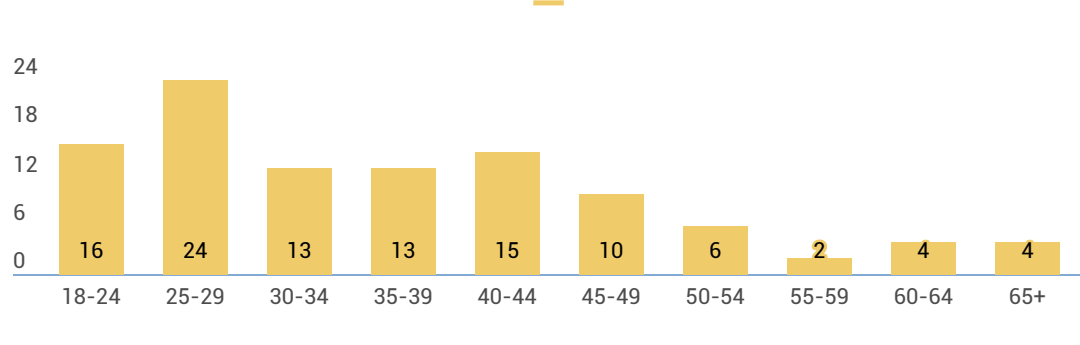
Financial Relief Disbursed Throughout Oregon

OWR's presence in Oregon is significant. Rehousing Fund has provided financial relief in 10 counties in Oregon.



Not all applicants had an address to provide - for this reason we were only able to identify 106 applicants out of the 107 on which county they reside

Oregonian families served by the RH Fund ranged in size from single-person households to large families.

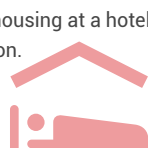
Community-Based Organizations (CBOs) conduct statewide community outreach.
