



# OREGON WORKER RELIEF

## Rehousing Fund (RH) Report | Quarter 1 (Jan-Mar, 2026)

More than 100 community partners have come together to create the Oregon Worker Relief Network, a rapid community-based system that provides temporary financial support like the Rehousing Fund. The Rehousing Fund supports Oregonian households experiencing homelessness by providing culturally responsive services essential for securing stable housing.

### Amount Disbursed



**\$2,905,000**

Rehousing Fund has allocated over **\$2.9 million** in relief to Oregonians experiencing homelessness or similar.



**\$1,530,420**

Amount actually spent on rehousing applicants through March 2026.



**\$14,303**

Average amount spent per household.

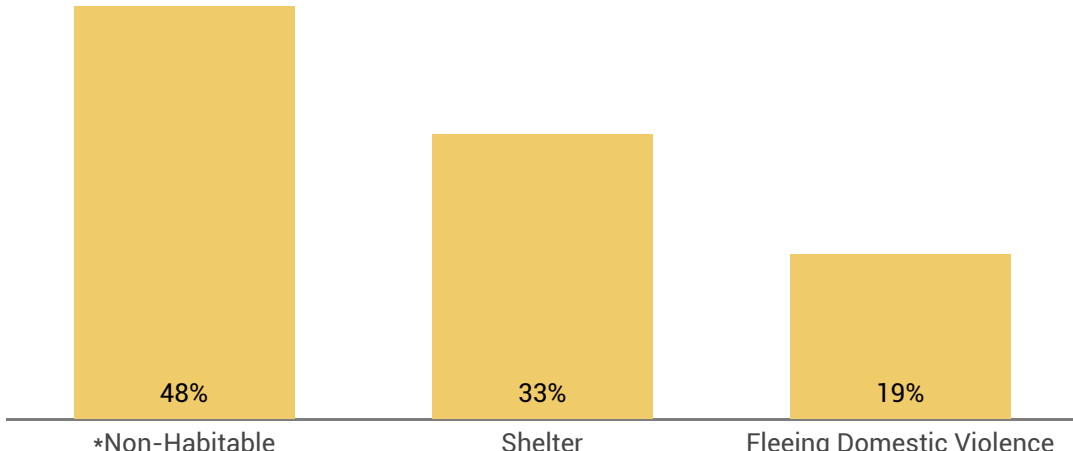
### Number of Recipients Who Received Aid

Have been approved and received services since the opening of fund in June 2025.

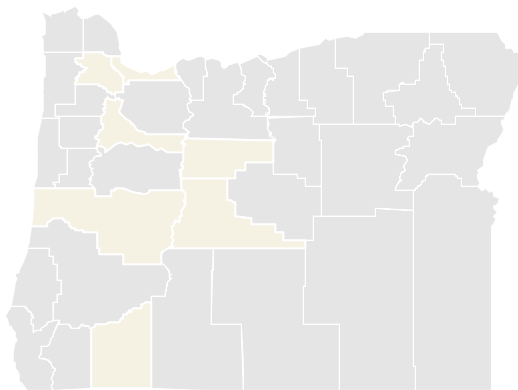
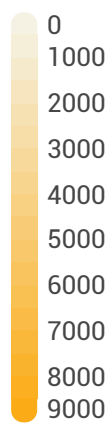
### Housing Situation Before Receiving Rehousing Fund



\*Non-Habitable housing includes living on the street, in a car, couch surfing or in another non-habitable location.

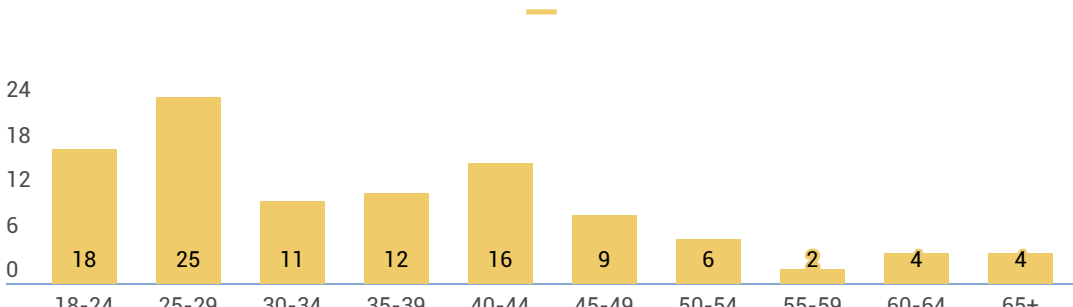
### Financial Relief Disbursed Throughout Oregon

OWR's presence in Oregon is significant. Rehousing Fund has provided financial relief in 7 counties in Oregon.

### Family Size of Rehousing Fund Recipients

Oregonian families served by the RH Fund ranged in size from single-person households to large families.



21% of RH recipients have 1 dependent minor child



26% of RH recipients have at least 2 dependent minor children

#### Triage Support

Out of the 107 households receiving funding, 21% of them received triage support in the form of funding for temporary housing at a hotel, motel, or other location.

Community Navigators assist program-eligible Oregonians through the OWR application process.
